



DECIDUOUS FRUIT TREES SPRING 2022



APPLES

ANNA – Remarkable fruit for mild winter climates. This yellow with red blush apple ripens in July and has heavy crops of sweet, crisp, flavorful apples. A top producer that's great for eating fresh, in pie, or sauced. Grows to 10'-20' T x 10'-20' W. Self-fertile, but produces more with Golden Dorsett or Einshaimer. Zones 6-9. (200-400 hrs)

GALA – A productive tree with orange-blushed yellow fruit. Has a nice blend of sweetness and tartness. Gala is excellent for eating fresh, baking or making jams. Fruit ripens in August. Grows to 20'-25' T x 25' W. Partially self-fertile, but produces more with Yellow Delicious or Granny Smith. Zones 5-9. (300-500 hrs)

GOLDEN DELICIOUS – A large, firm apple with smooth light green to creamy yellow skin. Its white flesh is crisp and aromatic with a sweet flavor excellent for eating fresh, baking or jams. Ripens late September. Grows to 18'-20' T x 18'-20' W. Self-fertile but produces more with Fuji, Granny Smith, Honeycrisp or Red Delicious. Zones 4-9. (700 hrs)

MOLLIES DELICIOUS – A very large, yellow-skinned with pink blush apple that is firm, sweet and juicy. Has a light yellow flesh with a delightfully pleasant flavor. Fruit ripens in late July-August. Grows to 15'-20' T x 15'-20' W. Pollinate with a Fuji, Golden Delicious, Honeycrisp or Granny Smith apple. Zones 5-9. (400-500 hrs)

RED DELICIOUS – A high-yielding tree producing large fruit with dark red skin and juicy white flesh. Sweet apple with little acidity. Blooms in spring and ripens September-October. Grows to 10'-25' T & W. Bears heavily when cross pollinated with Golden Delicious or Yellow Delicious. Prefers neutral to slightly acid soil. Zones 5-8. (900 hrs)

YELLOW DELICIOUS – A large, golden fruit that is sweet and delicious making it great for fresh eating, baking and preserves. Pollinate with Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith or Red Delicious. Ripens September-October. Zones 5-8. (650 hrs)

STANDARD – Grows 25' T & W. **SEMI DWARF** – Grows 12'-15' T & W. **DWARF** – Grows 10' T & W.



APRICOT

BLENHEIM – A medium-large, yellow skinned with orange blush freestone apricot that has a very sweet, aromatic flavor. Ripens late June - early July. Grows to 15'-25' T x 20' W. Self-fertile. Zones 4-8. (400-500 hrs)

MOORPARK – Best red apricot with a rich, luscious flavor. This large, firm apricot is a favorite for eating fresh. It ripens late June to early July. Grows to 15'-25' T x 20' W. Self-fertile. Freestone. Zones 6-9. (600-700 hrs)

PERFECTION – A very productive producer of large, bright orange fruit that is incredibly tender with a juicy flesh great for eating right off the branches. Blooms in March and ripens in August. Grows to 8'-10' T x 6'-8' W. Self-fertile. Freestone. Zones 4-8. (700 hrs)



NECTARINES

FLAVORTOP – A heavy-bearing tree that produces fruit with great flavor and sweetness. Fragrant pink spring flowers yield a summer harvest of large nectarines with smooth red skin and sweet yellow flesh. Grows to 20'-25' T x 20'-25' W. Self-Fertile. Freestone. Zones 6-9. (600 - 700 hrs)

SMOOTH TEXAN SERIES I & III – Produce high quality, yellow fleshed fruit that are tangy-sweet in flavor. Clingstones. Self-fertile. Grows to 10'-15' T x 8'-12' W. Zones 6-9. (550-600 hrs)

I – Ripens in mid-May. / **III** – Ripens in early June.

SMOOTH ZEST SERIES I & II – Clingstone. Self-fertile. Grows to 10'-15' T x 8'-12' W. (250 hrs)

I – A tangy-sweet flavor and white-fleshed. Ripens in early to mid-May. Zones 6-8. / **II** – Yellow-fleshed with an acidic, delicious flavor. Ripens early to mid-May. Zones 7-9.

SURECROP – Produces a large, freestone fruit that is golden with red blush and sweet, juicy flesh. Ripens late July. Self-fertile. Grows to 20' T x 20' W. Zones 5-9. (400 hrs)

(CHILL HOURS NEEDED AT OR BELOW 45 DEGREES)

FREESTONE: Flesh of the fruit separates easily from the pit. Used for eating fresh or freezing.

CLINGSTONE: Flesh of the fruit clings tightly to the pit. Used for canning.

PEACHES (ALL SELF-FERTILE)

BELLE OF GEORGIA – A super sweet white peach with red blush that has a firm freestone flesh tinged red. Ripens in August. Grows to 15'-30' T and W. Zones 5-9. (800-850 hrs)

DWARF BONFIRE – An ornamental tree grown more for its beautiful purple leaves and big showy double pink blooms; not very productive. Fruit is a very firm clingstone used for canning, pickling, and pies. Flesh is white, streaked with red and turns red when cooked making an attractive pie. Ripens August - September. Grows 5'-6' T & W. Zones 5-9. (300 hrs)

ELBERTA – Produces a large freestone fruit with red blushed skin over a golden yellow color with a great aroma and taste. Great for canning or eating fresh. Ripens July-August. Grows to 15'-20' T x 15'-20' W. Zones 5-9. (600 hrs)

FLAT DELIGHT TWO – A productive tree that produces medium-large semi-freestone peaches with sweet, yellow flesh and low acid. Ripens late May. Grows to 15'-20' T x 12'-15' W. Zones 7-9. (500 hrs)

FLORIDA KING – A large, red over gold skin peach with flavorful yellow-red melting flesh that is good for fresh eating. Ripens early May. Grows to 15'-20' T x 12'-15' W. Clingstone. Zones 8-9. (450 hrs)

FLORIDA PRINCE – Lavender-pink blooms in early spring followed by yellow-red, large peaches that are very delicious and juicy. Semi-freestone. Ripens May-June. Grows to 15' T. Zones 8-9. (150 hrs)

HALE HAVEN – A reliable productive tree that produces large fruit with red over orange-yellow skin and firm, juicy flesh complete with a rich sweet taste. Freestone. Ripens July-August. Grows to 10'-15' T x 12'-15' W. Zones 5-9. (850 hrs)

HARVESTER – Produces a firm, medium-sized red colored fruit with a yellow-orange background. Freestone. Harvest July-August. Grows to 10'-15' T & W. Zones 6-9. (750 hrs)

JOHN FANICK – Large, red blushed over yellow skin peach with yellow fleshed fruit of excellent flavor. Heavy, consistent producer. This new peach selection is from Fanick's Nursery in San Antonio Texas and named after the renowned nurseryman who gave so much to this industry. Ripens mid to late-July. Freestone. Grows to 10'-15' T & W. Zone 7. (450-500 hrs)

JUNE GOLD – A large, firm, yellow-fleshed, freestone peach with slight red blush that is exceptionally sweet. Ripens early June. Grows to 15'-20' T x 15'-20' W. Zone 6-9. (650 hrs)

LA FELICIANA – A large, firm, yellow-fleshed peach with dark red blush that has a delicious tangy flavor. Ripens mid-June to July. Freestone. Grows to 10'-12' T & W. Zones 7-9. (550-600 hrs)

MAJESTIC – A heavy producer of very large peaches that are juicy, sweet and full of flavor. Fruit has a yellow-red blushed skin and yellow flesh. Resistant to pests and diseases. Grows to 15' T & W. Freestone. Ripens July-August. Zones 5-8. (800 hrs)

RANGER – A vigorous tree that produces large, red-yellow fleshed peaches that are tangy-sweet in flavor. Grows to 15' T & W. Ripens in June. Freestone. Zones 3-7. (900-1000 hrs)

RED BARON – Good producer of large fruit with yellow skin and yellow flesh that is sweet and richly flavored. Showy display of double red flowers in spring. Ripens July-August. Freestone. Grows to 10'-15' T & W. Zones 7-9. (250-300 hrs)

RIO GRANDE – A productive tree with showy flowers and red blush on yellow-skinned peaches. Makes a wonderful addition to your backyard orchard. Ripens in June. Freestone. Grows to 15'-25' T x 15' W. Zones 5-9. (425 hrs)

ROYAL ZEST SERIES I, II & III – Productive trees that produce firm, yellow-fleshed peaches with a tangy-sweet flavor. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 7-9. (550-600 hrs)

I: Clingstone; ripens mid-may / **II:** Clingstone; ripens early June / **III:** Semi-freestone; ripens mid-June

SAM HOUSTON – A medium-large peach with a sweet, yellow flesh. Grows 12'-15' T & W. Ripens in June. Freestone. Zones 7-9. (500 hrs)

TEX PRINCE – Tangy-sweet, firm, yellow-fleshed peach that is a consistent performer. Ripens late May. Freestone. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 7-9. (550 hrs)

TEXSTAR – A medium-sized fruit with red skin and yellow flesh that has good quality and flavor. Good for canning, baking and eating fresh. Ripens in June. Freestone. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 8-10. (450 hrs)

(CHILL HOURS NEEDED AT OR BELOW 45 DEGREES)

FREESTONE: Flesh of the fruit separates easily from the pit. Used for eating fresh or freezing.

CLINGSTONE: Flesh of the fruit clings tightly to the pit. Used for canning.

PEARS

ASIAN PEAR, CHOJURO – Has golden brown skin and juicy, white flesh that is crisp like an apple when ripe. Harvest mid-August. Pollinate with any other Asian pear or Bartlett pear. Grows to 18'-20' T & 12'-13' W. Zones 5-8. (500 hrs)

ASIAN PEAR, SHINKO – A sweet, juicy pear that is crisp like an apple with golden brown skin and shows fire blight resistance. Ripens in September. Pollinate with any other Asian pear or Bartlett pear. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 6-9. (450-500 hrs)

ASIAN PEAR, SHINSEIKI – A juicy, sweet, refreshing pear that is crisp like an apple with bright yellow skin and ripens July-August. Pollinate with any other Asian pear or Bartlett pear. Grows to 25' T x 20' W. Zones 6-9. (250-300 hrs)

AYERS – An upright, vigorous tree that produces red blushed, yellow fruit with smooth, melting flesh that is very sweet in flavor. Partially self-fertile, but better crops will develop with another high chill variety like Bartlett pear. Grows to 20'-30' T x 20'-25' W. Ripens July-August. Zones 4-9. (500 hrs)

BARTLETT – World's most popular pear. Has a very juicy, spicy-sweet flavor. Ripens July-August. Partially self-fertile, but produces more with any other Asian pear, Moonglow, Ayers, etc.; a good pollinizer for most other pear trees. Grows to 20'-30' T & W. Zones 5-8. (500-600 hrs)

FLORIDA HOME – Large, semi-hard green pears that are sweet though slightly tart; eat fresh or can. Partially self-fertile, but produces better with another pear tree. Grows 15'-20' T x 12'-15' W. Ripens July-August. Zones 6-10. (400 hrs)

KIEFFER – A vigorous tree that produces a large hard pear with greenish-yellow skin blushed red with a crisp, juicy, white flesh and a sprightly flavor. Excellent for canning and cooking or even eating fresh once it has softened after picking! Pick before ripe for best texture and flavor. Good resistance to fire blight. Ripens August-September in South Texas. Grows to 20'-30' T x 20'-30' W. Self-fertile. A good pollinizer for most other pears. Zones 4-9. (250 hrs)

MOONGLOW – A hardy, productive tree that produces a large pear with brownish-green skin, soft flesh, moderately juicy and very sweet. Good for canning, desserts and fresh eating. Good resistance to fire blight. Ripens in August. Grows to 20'-30' T & W. Pollinate with Bartlett or Orient. Zones 5-9. (450 hrs)

ORIENT – A productive tree that produces large, yellow, sweet and juicy pears that have a creamy white flesh with a firm, smooth texture. Good for mild winter areas. Good fire blight resistance. Pollinate with Kieffer or Moonglow, Pineapple or Ayers. Good for canning, desserts and fresh eating. Ripens in August. Grows to 20'-30' T & W. Zones 5-9. (350 hrs)

PINEAPPLE PEAR – A producer of large, red-blushed yellow fruit with a crisp flesh and an unusually delicious pineapple flavor. Grows to 15'-20' T x 10'-15' W. Self-fertile, but produces more with Ayers, Kieffer or Orient. Ripens in August. Zones 4-9. (150 hrs)

PLUMS

BRUCE – Produces large plums with an orange-red skin and sweet yellow flesh. Good for canning, jellies and fresh eating. Pollinate with Methley or Santa Rosa plum trees. Ripens in June. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 6-9. (450 hrs)

BURBANK – Prolific producer of large purplish-red fruit with sweet, juicy, amber colored flesh and has excellent flavor. Good when eaten fresh, but also perfect for drying, packing, and preserving. Pollinate with Methley or Santa Rosa plum. Ripens in July. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 5-9. (400 hrs)

METHLEY – A vigorous grower and heavy bearing tree that produces a reddish-purple color plum with amber red flesh that is large, juicy and sweet making it excellent for fresh eating, jellies and preserves. Self-fertile, but produces better with Santa Rosa, Burgundy, Burbank, Bruce or Morris plum. Ripens June-July. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 5-9. (250 hrs)

MORRIS – Large plum with firm, red to purple flesh. Performs best at higher chill hours and when planted with another variety that will pollinate it like Santa Rosa or Methley Plum. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Ripens in early June. Zones 5-9. (650-800 hrs)

SANTA ROSA – A large, purplish-red fruit with amber yellow flesh that is sweet, tangy and firm. A prolific growing tree that is excellent for eating, jellies and preserves. Ripens June – July. Self-fertile. A good pollinizer for most other plums. Grows to 15'-20' T & W. Zones 5-9. (300 hrs)
